Consumers of these specialized services, specifically individuals who are deaf, DeafBlind, hard of hearing or who are speechdisabled, can communicate on the telephone via TTY, Voice Carry Over (VCO), Hearing Carry Over (HCO), Speech-to-Speech (STS), Spanish and Captioned Telephone. This helps ensure the ability to connect with family, friends or businesses with ease.

How does relay work?

Simply dial 711 to connect with Washington Relay. A qualified Communication Assistant (CA) will ask for the area code and the number of the person you wish to contact before beginning to relay the call. Generally, the CA will voice the typed message from the text telephone (TTY) user to you. The CA will then relay your voiced response by typing it to the TTY user.
